1) Program mission and goals:

The Master of Landscape Architecture (MLA) program at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa prepares its graduates to become leaders of the next generation of landscape architects. Trained in the extraordinary Hawaiian landscape, students are equipped with emerging tools and strategies needed to enhance a beautiful, resilient, and healthy built environment. As the only professional landscape architecture program in Hawai'i, situated within a Carnegie R1 land, sea, space, and sun grant university, the MLA advances contemporary urban landscape design teaching, theory, and practice in the state and tropical Asia-Pacific coastal regions with a dedicated focus on ecological and social sustainability by design.

2) MLA accreditation status

The Landscape Architectural Accreditation Board (LAAB) at its February 9, 2023, meeting granted accreditation for a period of six (6) years to the course of study leading to the professional MLA degree at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. Accreditation is awarded on a time-certain basis. The program is next scheduled for LAAB review during fall 2028.
